**Sacrament of Baptism:** Baptisms are celebrated as a community at Mass at 1:15 p.m. on the second and fourth Sundays of the month outside of Lent. Parents who wish to present a child for Baptism call for an appointment with one of the priests, to discuss the meaning of the Sacrament and the responsibilities being undertaken. The date and time for Baptism will be arranged at this meeting.

**Sacrament of Marriage:** Arrangements should be made six months in advance. Meet with a priest to express your intentions and freedom to marry. Once this is established a date and time may be secured. Attendance at a Pre-Cana Conference is required. All arrangements for a wedding must be completed one month before your wedding day.

**Sacrament of the Sick:** Please notify a priest for those seriously ill. Please make arrangements while your loved one is still conscious and can personally accept this eternal grace.

**Letters of Recommendation:** Letters of Recommendation to act as sponsors for the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation are given to registered members of the parish who attend Mass and Communion regularly and either have raised or are raising their own children (if any) in the Faith.

**New Parishioners:** Formal registration in the parish is accepted at the Parish Office. Please introduce yourself to our parish priests at Mass on Sunday. If you are moving or there is a change in address, please notify the parish office.

**Adoration Chapel:** Open to public from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. every day.

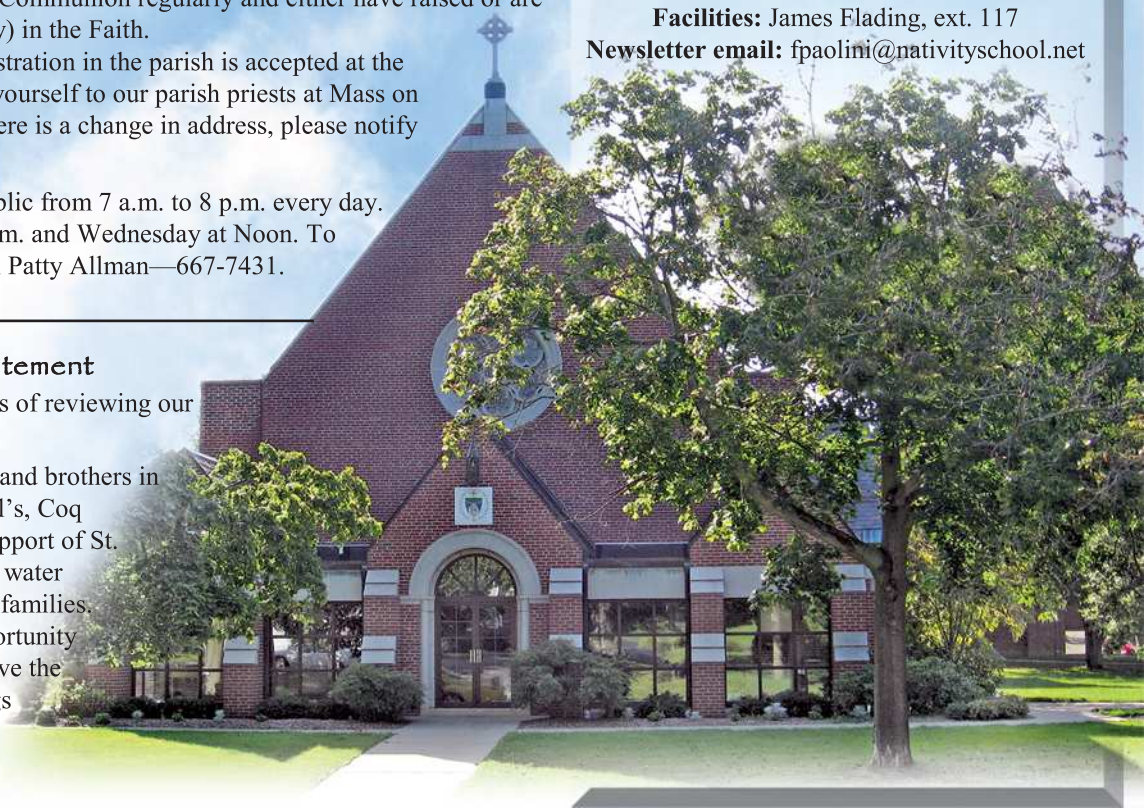

## GROWING IN FAITH FOR ADULTS

Among the courses that are being offered this Fall at Christ the King Seminary, East Aurora, in the Continuing Education Program is Fr. Peter Drilling's course called METAPHYSICS. The course will be offered on ten Mondays, from 9:30-11:30 am, beginning on September 12 and ending on Nov. 28 (no class on Columbus Day or during Thanksgiving week). Tuition is \$125.00. ## FAITH FORMATION

**SUMMER SCHEDULE:** The Faith Formation Office is closed during the month of July. Phone messages are retrieved, and calls returned on a regular basis during this time. The forms can be downloaded, filled out, and mailed to the Church Office, 43 Argyle Place along with the applicable fee. If you have any questions, or do not have access to a computer, forms are available from the Faith Formation Office; please leave a message at 662-2169 and someone will return your call.

### OVERVIEW OF FALL FAITH FORMATION

**CHILDREN'S CONNECTION:** Elementary Sessions for children in grades 1-6, are scheduled once each week, with a choice of two different days, at four different times. Story telling, prayer, and fun activities relate Nativity's Children's Connection and the Sunday Scriptures to family living with Lectionary Based Catechesis.

Families may choose **Mondays:** 4:15-5:15pm or 5:45-6:45pm, **Wednesdays** 4:15-5:15pm or 5:45-6:45pm.

Children are placed in groups according to their formation level. The groups named "PROMISE" consists of children in first grade. The groups named "GOOD NEWS" are children from second or third grades. The groups named "VENTURE" consist of children in fourth and fifth grades combined or sixth grade. Sessions begin Monday, Sept. 19 or Wednesday, Sept. 21.

**Y.E.S.:** Youth Engaging Scripture provides weekly Junior High Catechesis for grades 7 & 8. Y.E.S. presents a dynamic large group format where youth explore the teachings of the Catholic Church (based on the Catechism of the Catholic Church), the message of Christ, and their meaning for us today. Y.E.S. participants engage with each other in large and small group discussions, and various hands on activities. Music, friends, and food complete the makeup of the Y.E.S. Community. Y.E.S. sessions are on Thursdays from 7-8:15pm in the Nativity School cafeteria and begin on Sept. 22.

**L.O.F.T.:** Learning Our Faith Together, High School Catechesis, (grades 9-12). In a conversational setting, leaders and teens focus on learning to discern and communicate the teachings of the Catholic Church and the message of Christ for our world today. Seeking an awareness of the movements of the Holy Spirit, and discovering our gifts, we seek to discern our participation in the Mission of Christ. L.O.F.T. sessions are on Thursdays from 7-8:15pm and begin Sept. 22. Parents are encouraged to attend any or all sessions.

### SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION

Attending Mass on the Lord's Day is vital to preparing your child for all the Sacraments. Witnessing your regular Communion with Christ will help your child/ren grow in faith; then by the Grace of God, they will gradually come to recognize Him in Word, Sacrament, and our Parish Community. Parents that receive the sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist regularly and joyfully impress in the hearts and minds of their child/ren the truth of the grace received when we ourselves open our hearts and minds to the mystery of divine love. **Please complete the request/registration form found on the parish website for all sacraments.**

**FIRST RECONCILIATION:** Preparing a child for his or her first experience of Reconciliation with God, is typically, but not necessarily approached when the child is in second grade. At a child's Baptism, parents accept the responsibility of training him or her in the practice of the faith. It is thereby the duty of the parents to bring the child up to keep God's commandments as Christ taught us, by loving God, (participating in the sacraments), and loving our neighbor as ourselves (acts of charity, justice and peace).

Materials to guide parents through preparing their children for First Reconciliation will be distributed at parent meetings on Wednesday, Sept. 14 at 7pm or Tuesday, September 20, at 7pm. Note that the First Reconciliation and First Eucharist parent meetings are held together in the church on the same evening. They are intentionally combined. Additional resources and information to assist the family in preparing their child for First Reconciliation will be distributed on Sunday Oct. 16, (last initials A-K) and Sunday October 23, (last initials L-Z).

**FIRST EUCHARIST:** A special sacramental journey is offered for families of children preparing to receive the Reality of Christ in the Eucharist for the first time, (typically in third grade). After your child has received First Reconciliation, the responsibility of training him or her in the practice of the faith continues.

Materials to guide parents through preparing children for their First Eucharist will be distributed at parent meetings on Wednesday, September 14 at 7pm or Tuesday, September 20, at 7pm. Meetings will be held in the church on both evenings combined with the Reconciliation parents. Additional materials and support for preparing children for First Eucharist is offered at three separate Family Gatherings throughout the year. Family Gatherings are scheduled on Sundays from 9:50-10:20am. Each of the three gatherings is presented on two different occasions. Family Gathering I on September 25 or October 2, Family Gathering II on November 6 or 13, and Family Gathering III on March 4 or 11. First Eucharist Families are also invited to celebrate the Easter Season and further prepare for their child/ren's First Holy Communion by attending a Faith & Family Day in April. Families choose one of the following dates for their Faith and Family Day: Sunday April 15, 12:30-2:30, Saturday, April 21, 3:00-5:15 or Sunday April 22, 12:30-2:30. The Faith & Family Day is intended for the entire family, siblings included. The Sunday Liturgy and a time for refreshments are included as part of this special day.

### CONFIRMATION NEWS

For our Fall Confirmation preparation sessions, we will be registering primarily those teens who wish to be confirmed and who will be enrolled in the 10th grade in Fall 2011. Additionally, any 11th or 12 graders who wish to be confirmed are also invited to enroll.
