Confirmation candidates may participate in a variety of service opportunities to complete their ministry requirement. We serve others as members of the Body of Christ here on earth and to initiate us into what the Church asks of all its members in emulation of Jesus Christ and for his honor and glory. Some possibilities for this service are listed below:

- ➡ Neighborhood: Offer your services to the elderly or sick in your neighborhood to do yard work, shop for groceries, run other errands, etc.
